Spanning ages 16 to 21, our players have sufficient time to attain their goals with the Langley Rivermen or within the league. Our secondary emphasis is on comprehensive development, encompassing both on-ice and off-ice sessions.

By offering up to five practice sessions and three games weekly, we facilitate consistent progress. Our well-situated gym, adjacent to the dressing room, equips players to physically prepare for games, adapt to the season's demands, and seamlessly transition to NCAA or professional hockey levels.


